Filosofia Unisinos is one of the few journals of Philosophy in Latin America which is indexed by both *Web of Science* and *Scopus*, besides being the single one published in Brazil. In order to better fulfil our goal to connect Brazilian Philosophy to Latin America and Latin American Philosophy with the philosophical community of other continents, we are launching with this issue the call for papers for a new section fully dedicated to short English papers. This new section will be called *Philosophy South* and will appear at the second issue of 2016 (Vol. 17), winter issue for the South Hemisphere and summer issue for the North Hemisphere. For this new section, we are introducing two specific submission rules: articles must be submitted only in English, and must be no longer than 5000 words, all included. We had anticipated this movement in our second issue of 2014, with the difference that we will make *Philosophy South* just a section of the *Unisinos Journal of Philosophy*. With this new section we are interested, as planned, in fostering papers that get straight to the point, for which authors won't have to wait more than four months for a review, and in which their ideas can reach a broader audience in a clear, readable, and very focused style. We invite young as well as mature scholars to do good philosophy with fewer words! Until the 31st of March 2016, articles for the first issue of this new section are welcome. To the authors of the best three articles selected for the first issue of *Philosophy South* we will grant, beside the publication of their paper, a special prize. More on this competition will be disclosed in our next issue. For those from Brazil, Latin America, and elsewhere who are not native English speakers, we will continue to offer our free service to improve the style of approved articles for this section. With this service, we have been able to equalize conditions between native and non-native English speakers and to facilitate, for the latter, the communication of their ideas to the international philosophical community. Send us your short paper and help us to improve the north-south dialogue in philosophy.
